FROM AMBLEDEE TO ZUMBLE-DEE (Houghton Mifflin, \$2.50. Ages 4 to 8) is an alphabet of marvelous imaginary insects which we recognize instantly from the "slimy LEAMY-LOAMY" to the KWEEP ("when you think he's fast asleep./All of a sudden, he goes kweep") to the horrible URKLESNUG who lurks in the sand. Sandol Stoddard Warburg, who invented this heavenly nonsense, and her illustrator, Walter Lorraine, withstand the inevitable comparison with Edward Lear and come out with colors, and insects, flying.
